

### Championing Southbury's 1937 Story - Part Two BY ED EDELSON

In my previous blog, I discussed how I helped bring the obscure Southbury story to national attention, making it a source of community pride. Through my research for the documentary, I connected with the US Holocaust Memorial Museum, leading to the inclusion of Southbury's story in the 2018 exhibit "Americans and the Holocaust." This exposure brought further attention through webinars and research papers. In 2018, I proposed installing a historic plaque at the South Britain Congregational Church, which was completed in 2022, enhancing community awareness and pride.



In 2021, I published a children's book, "Lois's Story: How a Young Girl's Inspiration Helps Stop Hate and Fear," to convey the story's lessons to younger audiences. Together with Rabbi Eric, we created an "Educator's Guide," which was recognized by Region 15's Equity and Inclusion Council. The book inspired students to form the Upstander's Club. For the documentary's 10-year anniversary, I planned commemorative events, including tributes, seminars, and a special walk. Additionally, I initiated the naming of "The 1937 Pond" at Heritage Village, with a dedication ceremony in November 2023.
